Activities

What a year! It started off with meetings and discussions about the proposed USFS & NPS Climbing and Fixed anchor regulations. It ended with five volunteers doing two days of work replacing the anchors at the Playground. In between, we cleaned up some crags, sorted and inventoried hardware, climbed & camped at COR, talked with land managers, and took care of waste at the Fins.

- USFS and NPS Proposed Climbing regulation In no small part due to your emails and communications, the EXPLORE Act was passed by Congress, and is waiting for the President's signature to become law. When enacted, part of the law will "recognize that recreational climbing (including the use, placement, and maintenance of fixed anchors) is an appropriate use within a component of the National Wilderness Preservation System." - The Fins
 - We continued the WAG bag project in cooperation with the Southern Idaho Climbers Coalition (SICC). Three dispensers were placed in May and removed in November; one at the Corral, one at the Mortal Earth parking lot, and one on the trail to the Headwall. The EICC and SICC jointly provided all the WAG bags, and with volunteers help refilled the dispensers. Hundreds of bags were provided, helping to remove human waste from this fragile environment. Thank you to all the volunteers who help out with this project.
- The Playground
 - We gave The Playground some love this year. In May, we cleaned up over 500lbs of trash and in November we replaced all the old anchors. Without volunteers this couldn't be done thank you.
- Box Canyon

Anchors on several climbs were updated. Thank you, Jarren for doing the hard work.

- Other activities
 - Donated a prize at the ISU climbing competition.
 - Tabled at events throughout the year.
